**10/136 Public Questions/Police Report**

No public questions.

PC Toms reported 10 crimes and 43 incident logs generated in the parish during December. PC Toms was currently unsure of the position with regard to the future of St Blazey police station because of the budgetary cuts.

It was proposed by Cllr Johnstone, seconded Cllr Brasier and RESOLVED that the minutes be confirmed and signed by the Chairman. Cllr Hughes and Cllr Penny abstained from voting.

**10/139 To receive the report from the Cornwall Councillor**

He was disappointed to confirm that planning permission for the Polmear Parc development had been granted by the planning committee the previous evening despite strong local and parish council opposition. It was also disappointing that the result had only been confirmed by the Chairman's casting vote. Given that permission had now been granted Cllrs urged any local people who were eligible for affordable housing to express an interest as soon as possible.

**10/142 Correspondence List**

The correspondence list had been circulated and the file was available for Cllrs attention.

*Item 1.* Cllrs agreed to check their diaries and confirm dates with the Clerk for attendance at the Traffic Management Training.

The Clerk reported that a planning application for two wind turbines at Trevenning Farm had been submitted although she had yet to see the documentation. Whilst this was in Lanlivery parish, the proposal would obviously have an impact on Tywardreath & Par parish so it was agreed that this should be an agenda item at the next planning meeting.

#### **10/143 Finance**

Cllr Hughes proposed, Cllr Brasier seconded and it was RESOLVED that accounts to the value of £506.60 be approved.

#### **10/144 Resolutions from Councillors**

#### **10/145 Vine Place Parking Bays**

Cllr Hughes had so far been unable to obtain any further quotes but would continue to try.

#### **10/146 Par Beach Complex**

Cllr Wildish reported that there would be a public consultation meeting on 5<sup>th</sup> February at the Gott Hall (*note amended date*); she would continue to liaise with Martin Eddy as to what role the parish council would be expected to play. Cllr Wildish also suggested that it might be appropriate to investigate the possibility of registering Par Beach as a village green in order to safeguard it in the long term. There was general support for this idea and Cllr Wildish agreed to explore the options and report back to members in due course. Cllr Hughes reported that he was meeting with Miles Dewhurst and Jonny Alford in the near future as Mr Dewhurst wanted to change the use of 2 of the tennis courts to more youth orientated facilities. Cllr Johnstone reported several breaches in the terms of the licence agreement at the campsite, including that that a new log cabin had been put in place without permission to replace the old wardens hut. He undertook to report the breaches to planning enforcement.

#### **10/147 Moorland Road Bus Shelter**

Cllr Johnstone reported that Ben Dickinson had assured him that morning that the concrete base would be put in place within 7 days. Cllr Hughes added that Teresa Frost had confirmed that this would be done.

#### **10/148 Community Emergency Plan**

Cllr Wildish reported that the Environment Committee was working on a draft Plan. She also suggested that an application could be made to the Pontsmill Turbine Community Fund for a supply of fridge magnets to be distributed to every house within the flood plain giving emergency information. Cllr Johnstone agreed to follow up on this.

#### **10/149 Terms of Reference**

It was proposed by Cllr Brasier, seconded Cllr Johnstone and RESOLVED that the Environment Committee Terms of Reference compiled by the Clerk

and circulated to all members should be adopted by the parish council –

### **10/150 Parish Councillors Reports**

Cllr Penny reported that further grants were available from the Pontsmill Turbine Fund.

Cllr Brasier reported that she had made some enquiries about how many mugs would be needed if the parish decided to mark the Royal Wedding by presenting them to the children in the parish; there were approximately 300 pupils at the school plus some at the pre-school. Cllr Wildish wondered if it would be more appropriate to host a party, given the current financial situation. Cllr Hughes queried if the village fete committee was planning anything as he felt that it might be possible to link into this, rather than for the parish council to take the lead. He agreed to ascertain the position.
